Wally was born in Trumbull, Connecticut to Harry and Mary Reynolds. He was preceded in death by his parents, four brothers and a sister. Wally graduated from Roger Ludlowe High School in Connecticut in 1940 and was immediately hired by DuPont Co. to work as a welder. WWII was imminent, so he took a job in the Alcoa CO. making airplane cores.

War broke out and he enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1942. He fought in many battles including the fierce fighting of Tarawa, Saipan and Tinian in the Pacific. Discharged at the end of the war in 1945, he was hired by Southern New England Telephone Company, which is now AT&T.

After 30 years at the telephone company, Wally and Marge retired and moved to Palm Desert, CA so Wally could play golf every day. He also enjoyed playing bridge and the guitar.

Wally was involved in numerous civic affairs in the cities of Palm Desert and La Quinta, CA. He was hired in Palm Desert as a code enforcement officer. Wally was instrumental in sponsoring a new Senior Center in La Quinta, CA and was president of that organization for 3 years.

Wally and his wife moved to Stillwater, OK in 2004 to be near their daughter Kathleen, son-in-law Peter and grandson Christopher. They were married 73 years when the Lord accepted Marge. He was a devoted and loving husband.

Wally was proud to have reached his 100th birthday in July 2022. He enjoyed his celebration with family, friends, and care givers at Golden Oaks.
